# **Hand Hygiene**

According to the Centers for Disease Control, hand hygiene is the most important measure to prevent the spread of infections among patients and dental healthcare professionals.

#### **Infection Control Checklist**

All dental healthcare personnel (and TeamSmile volunteers) must perform hand hygiene:

- when hands are visibly soiled with blood or other potentially infectious materials.
- after barehanded touching of inanimate objects likely to be contaminated by blood, saliva, or respiratory secretions.
- before and after treating each patient.
- before putting on gloves.
- immediately after removing gloves.

### **Technique**

There are four steps in the process.

- 1. Make sure all organic matter is removed from your hands. All visible organic matter (such as dirt) must be removed from hands prior to applying waterless hand sanitizer.
- 2. Apply a dime-sized amount of waterless hand sanitizer to the palm of one hand.
- 3. Rub hands together covering all surfaces of hands and fingers.
- 4. Rub until waterless hand sanitizer is absorbed.

#### How it works

Waterless hand sanitizer provides several advantages over hand washing with soap and water. However, it is not effective if organic matter (dirt, blood, or other material) is visible on the hands. There are many benefits of using a waterless hand sanitizer over hand washing. These include:

- Requires less time than hand washing.
- Acts quickly to kill microorganisms on the hands.
- Is more accessible than sinks.
- Reduces bacterial counts on the hands.
- Does not promote antimicrobial resistance.
- Is less irritating to the skin than soap and water.
- Some types can improve the condition of the skin.
